Preface

This was a pilot study undertaken in March 1971 to test some questions and batteries for the main study. It was designed by SSRC Survey Unit and the fieldwork was carried out by Research Services Limited.

There were 213 respondents drawn by a quota sampling method.

An SPSS system file was created from the 2 cards of raw data and the 4 cards of spread out multipunches. The order of the tables in this manual is the order in which they appear on the system file, not necessarily the questionnaire order.

Any codes which have been declared missing on the system file have been asterisked.

- Q.26a) If 'Don't know' write 'D.K.' but avoid this if possible. and c)

- Q.26b) Are asked only if code 1 or 2 has been ringed for the preceding and d) question a) or c) respectively.

Don't accept 'don't know' replies to b) or d) if at all possible.

Q.27/28 Please record answers to open ended questionnaires as fully as possible.

The informant doesn't have to think of actual persons that he'd like to be or not like to be but he may if he wishes. Many will prefer to think of imaginary persons.

Q.29 If in reply to part a) informant places himself exactly in the middle between the person he'd most like to be and the person he'd least like to be, code 3 directly, otherwise ask part b), and code 1,2,4 or 5 in accordance with his reply to the two parts.

Classification data (1)

- b) A garden of your own - ie belonging to the household.
- c) A cheque book of your own - ie can you write cheques in your own name.
- d) Stocks and shares - do you personally (not another member of the household) own some.
- e) Have you a colour TV - ie is there one in the household.
- f) Your own telephone - ie one private to the household, not eg, a coinbox 'phone on the landing in a subdivided house.

0.1a List all members of the family unit, that is, related members of the household, including children. Record their relationship to the informant, their sex, marital status, normal occupational status, and their age-last birthday. Also record the age group and the terminal education age of the informant. 'School' includes colleges of further education.

0.1b Any other members of the household not related to the informant must be recorded in the grid at this question. The same personal details are required, except for Age Group and Terminal Education Age.

Classification Data (11)Employment code

Code 7, 8 or 9 should be ringed here for head of household. If the head of household is not in full-time employment and has a total income of under £8 per week from all sources - state pension, private pension, part-time job, private means, disability pension, compensation, etc. -(i.e. Code 9 ringed) then you should look for a Chief Wage Earner in that person's household.

(Note that the figure of £8 per week relates only to the income of the head of the household, thus, if a man and his wife are O.A.P.'s and the husband is the head of the household you would only take amount of his pension and not that of their combined incomes. Additional payments from national assistance and children's allowances should also be disregarded.)

IF EMPLOYMENT CODE 9 IS RINGED, CHECK BACK WITH HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION TO FIND A C.W.E. IN THE HOUSEHOLD

The employment questions asked in the survey are quite detailed. The whole idea of this procedure is to obtain an idea of the Head of Household's (or Chief Wage Earner's) actual employment and his/her status in that employment. Hence the need to ask about actual rank or grade or title held, as well as getting a description of the firm or organisation this person works for and what he or she actually does there. Record under A.

If this person is a manager, foreman, chargehand or ganger, etc., find out the number of staff employed at the place where that person works including him/her, and the number for whom that individual is responsible. Please obtain the best approximation you can. Even "under two hundred" written against "25 or more" is better than "Don't know". If the informant is not the head of household, or Chief Wage Earner, obtain the same details regarding his/her employment and record under B.

Income Card

Note that this lists NET income. Furthermore, income is noted in three ways - weekly, monthly (i.e. 12 payments per year), and yearly. Allow the informant to use whichever he/she finds most convenient and then ring the appropriate code. We are interested in average (not basic) net income, i.e. average take-home pay, after deductions for income tax, national insurance, pension schemes, and so on. There are two additional levels added to the scale since last year, bringing the top category to £3,000 or more.

The income question should be asked of all informants, including those aged under 21. However, you are asked to use a certain amount of tact in asking this question. For example, if you are interviewing a young member of the household and the parent whose income is in question is actually present, explain that you have to ask everyone this question because it is on the questionnaire. If you get conflicting answers from two members of the household write a note e.g. "Son says £850 but father said £1050".

Explain to informants that we do not want to know their income (or the H.O.H's income) exactly, but only to get a rough idea of the income bracket by asking them to choose one of the codes. This is for the purpose of classifying the readers of the different publications. Explain, too, that informants do not have to answer this question if they don't want to.

In general, remember that it is better not to risk losing the informant's goodwill if he is touchy about revealing his income.

If the informant has no idea of the income in question, write 'D.K'.

Length of Interview

Make a note of the time you start the interview and the time you finish. Then write in the space provided the length of the interview in minutes. Also code the time of finishing using the 24 hour clock.
